Becoming a Senator

YOU ARE ALREADY A SENATOR! If you attend the first meeting as an incoming student, you are automatically a senator.

If you miss the first meeting, it takes three meetings to become a senator. On the third meeting, you gain the ability to vote on funding requests.

Senators are expected to attend each meeting – for every meeting you miss, you must make up the same amount to remain a senator.



Examples of events

Funding requests

If you are interested in presenting a funding request to the senate, request sheets are available in the Activities office, and can be turned in before the meeting. You will then attend the meeting to explain your request to the Senate.

Officers

- Chair manages the agenda, leads the discussion, and holds votes
- Vice Chair leads an icebreaker and fills in for the chair
- Secretary records minutes of the meeting and takes attendance
- Treasurer manages the senate's budgets and leads funding request sessions
- Parliamentarian possesses and modifies the Senate constitution
- PR / Snacks posts flyers, banners, and other advertisements, and buys snacks for every meeting
